


School Snack

YORK ART GALLERY

York Art Gallery recently put out a challenge to York Primary Schools called 'An Alternative View of York'. A painting by John Piper 'View from Clifford's Tower' painted in 1951 was used as inspiration and schools were encouraged to choose a new way to look at the City.

Class 6BY entered the competition with a large collage picture in chalk pastel and poster paint entitled 'Future York' which attempts to envisage what the City will look like in 2451, 500 years after John Piper's painting. There were entries from 74 classes representing 15 schools.

We were delighted to find out that our entry has been chosen as one of the five winners. The judges were impressed by the 'careful observation in the drawing of historic buildings and the joyful imagination in the futuristic architecture and vehicles'.

The picture will be included in an exhibition at York Art Gallery from 29th April to 30th July. In addition the Gallery have arranged for a professional artist, Jake Attree, to work for two days with the children and the work produced with him will also feature in the exhibition.
