



SEND - Remote Teaching and Learning Guidance

What Will Remote Teaching and Learning Look Like for My Child/ren?

We are committed to providing the best possible level of support and learning experiences for our children who have additional needs in all year groups across the school.

Children with an EHCP will be offered a place in school. If parents and carers choose to take up the place, the usual support will continue to be provided as when schools are fully open. This will include 1:1 support where appropriate and full support within the classroom.

If parents and carers choose not to take up the place, full support will be given via remote teaching and learning with adaptations made to the activities shared with our SEND children. Work is shared via the usual online platforms - Tapestry (EY), See Saw and Google Classroom. SEND children are familiar with these platforms and support is also available for parents and carers to ensure full accessibility. Classroom teachers will work closely with the SENDCO to ensure full accessibility for children with SEND including adapted work and/or resources to support learning.

Links and logins are also provided for various apps and websites that support learning. These will be shared with individual children depending on which program best supports their needs.

Work set by class teachers will be differentiated according to need and/or ability to ensure that SEND children are able to access activities similar in nature to their peers. Work is differentiated by outcome, quantity and extra scaffolding is provided bu teachers via the online platforms with additional instructions via voice message or reading of instructions or texts. Parents and Carers are encourage to scribe for their child if needed and able to do so.

Parents and Carers are ale to contact the class teacher via the online platforms to see support and/or advice around their child's learning. Parents and carers are also consulted around the amount of work their child is able to complete and this is taken into account when classroom staff are planning and sharing activities.

For children with a higher level of need or where accessibility or connectivity are a problem, paper learning packs can be provided and collected from school or delivered to home.
