We offer free courses and workshops for parents, grandparents and carers to give them the confidence to support their child's development at home. Our tutors love engaging adults with education in a safe and welcoming environment. There is always an opportunity to ask questions and be honest about challenges.

Parents improve their self-esteem and feel empowered to talk to their children about what they are learning and also have the confidence to talk to their child's teachers and be more involved in school life.




By building positive relationships between home and school, children and parents learning together can develop a lifelong love of learning and find new and exciting ways to explore the world together.

How Children Learn Maths

Autumn Term

For parents/carers of primary-aged children

10 week course to help support parents or carers with their child's learning and discover the maths strategies used in schools. We explore the resources that children may have access to, as well as structures such as bar models and partwhole models and how they are beneficial for deeper learning.

In addition, we look at simple games that can be replicated at home so that parents have a bank of tools to support maths skills such as number bonds, mental arithmetic and times tables.
